The Lord is opening doors and giving us opportunities to get together with other Native ministries to encourage our people, and to show them that they are not alone, that there are other Native believers out there.

In the first week of September we had our first "Friends of First Nations" Camp Meeting at Six Nations Reserve in southern Ontario.





Pastor Ken Hess and the dear people of Lighthouse Bible Baptist Church did a wonderful job of hosting the meeting, and it was a great time of fellowship, testimonies, good, Godly music, great preaching, and lots of food.

While we were there we met two other Native pastors from the area, and several others who have a heart for First Nations peoples.

It was a very encouraging and refreshing meeting, and we are planning to do it again next year in the first week of August.

We are praying that the Lord would use these meetings to reach Native souls for our Saviour, to encourage believers, and to raise up more labourers for the harvest.

On September 20 we had our first Men's Prayer Breakfast at Paul Band Bible Baptist Church. We had eleven men show up, and I believe it was an encouragement to them.

We almost had a stabbing afterwards out in front of the church, but thankfully it was broken up before that happened.

We had our special Thanksgiving service and dinner yesterday at church, and we were able to share the Gospel with many people from the community. We started the service with about twenty people, but by the end of the

service we had about sixty five, and several more came for the dinner afterwards.



We had Thanksgiving a week early this time because Sheri and I will be travelling next week down to the States to present our ministry at a missions conference at a church in Houston, Texas.

I am no longer framing houses in my other job. After much prayer and consideration, I have decided to work closer to home, by myself, on smaller jobs like decks, fences, etc.

This way I will not have the responsibility of always being there for the crew, and it will be much easier to get away and go to the reserve on short notice for the many needs out there.

Please continue to pray for Stacy Bull. She is growing in the Lord, and as He reveals things to her, she is letting go of things that her family and others expect her to do according to their traditions. It is not easy for her, but she is taking a stand for the Lord. Yesterday we celebrated her three years sober, and gave her a nice new Bible.



Please pray for Priscilla Rain. She has been facing a lot of problems from her adult children, most of whom are stuck in addictions. She has been bringing her grandkids to church, and they are doing well.

Please pray for Edwin Bull. He is discouraged and very concerned about his sons, who both need to be saved.

Please pray for Ron and Brenda Potts, and the Thursday night meetings at Alexis Nakota Sioux Nation. They are facing opposition from family and others, and Ron has been having some health issues.
